

She co-chairs the Human Trafficking committee for the Helfer Society, and the Education/Training committee for HEAL Trafficking, an organization of medical professionals working on human trafficking issues.

Kyle currently serves as the Executive Director of the Sexual Assault Support Center, formerly known as Columbus Rape Crisis. Kyle has been the Director for the last 18 years, but she began her service as a volunteer victim advocate for the Center in 1990.
